# Newgrange - Brú na Bóinne

Brú na Bóinne is the name given to an extensive and hugely important archaeological landscape situated on the north bank of the River Boyne. The site is dominated by three large passage tombs - Newgrange, Knowth and Dowth, which were declared a World Heritage Site by Unesco in 1993.

Constructed during the neolithic period, the tombs at Brú na Bóinne are around 5000 years old. At dawn on the morning of the winter solstice, and for a number of days before and after, the main chamber at Newgrange is illuminated by a beam of sunlight. The alignment is too precise to have occurred by chance.

# **Hill Of Slane**



St. Patrick has become synonymous with all things Irish; from shamrocks to the shortage of snakes on this Isle, but there was a time when he was viewed as a foreign Christian missionary come to convert Ireland's Celtic pagans. This he did with great symbolic flare. As the Druids celebrated their feast day on the Hill of Tara, Patrick prepared the Easter feast on the Hill of Slane. He lit his paschal fire at Slane, before the Druids could kindle their sacred fire at Tara. Seeing the flames at Slane, the Druids, warned Laegaire, the High King, that if Patrick's fire was not put out immediately, it would burn forever in Ireland. The rest is history.

#### Slane Castle

Set in the middle of a 1,500 acre estate in the heart of the Boyne Valley, Slane Castle has been home to the Conyngham family since 1703. In its existing form the Castle was reconstructed in 1785 and is principally the work of James Gandon, James Wyatt and Francis Johnston. Steeped in history and flanked by the majestic river Boyne, the castle has a mystical quality which hosts many high profile events, from Summer Concerts with a capacity of 80,000 people, to intimate Events, Weddings and Historical Tours inside in the castle.






# Irish Military War Museum

# **Francis Ledwidge Museum**

The Francis Ledwidge Museum in Slane is the cottage birthplace of WWI soldier poet Francis Ledwidge. Much of his poetry was inspired by the flora and fauna of Meath before he was killed in action in 1917. The cottage is a perfect example of a 19th century farm labourer's home and houses the poet's works and artefacts from World War I, alongside memorabilia of the period. There is a tranquil garden to the rear of the museum.
