



SLANE HISTORIC TRAIL

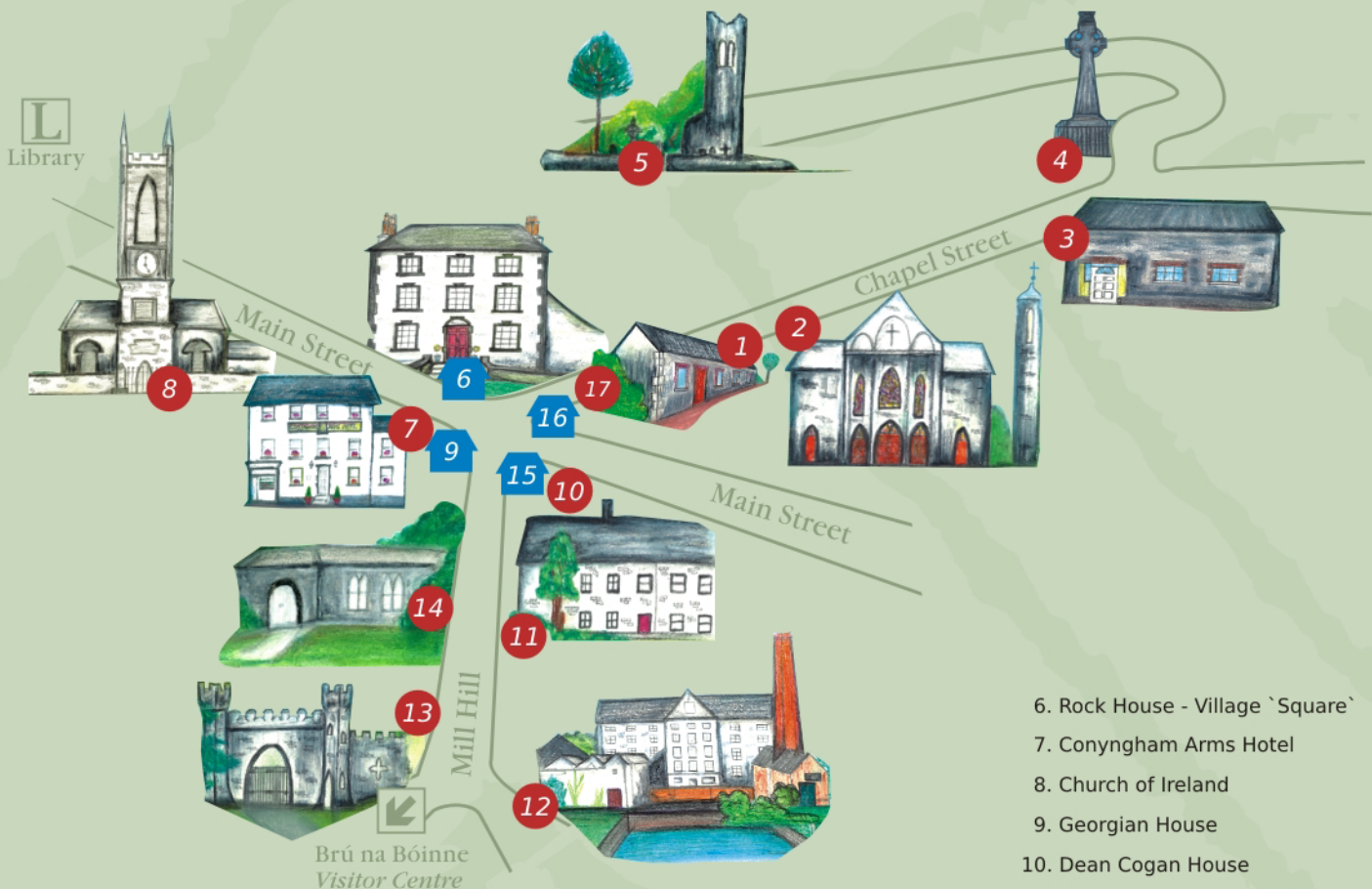

Slane is an elegant 18th century hillside estate village on the beautiful River Boyne. Slane is surrounded by heritage, history and legend and this is excellently profiled in the Slane Historic Trail. Some of the points include the Hill of Slane whereby St. Patrick lit the first paschal fire and introduced Christianity to Ireland. Slane Mill is a fine example of Georgian industrial architecture and the River Boyne and Canal run alongside it. The World Heritage Site of Brú na Bóinne encompassing Newgrange, Knowth and Dowth is located closeby.

However, modern day Slane is better known the world over for the legendary pop concerts at Slane Castle.

Slane's historical past is brought to life through a series of plaques and panels placed at points of interest along a route as outlined in the map. Commencing at the Slane Cottages, take 45 minutes to walk this self guided route through the village and sample the cafes, pubs and shops as you go.

Enjoy your visit to the estate village of Slane!
