
Alright Pumpkin



Lismullin Cookery School welcomes all participants, from young children & teens, to adults, who enjoy cooking for fun or at a professional level. They provide a variety of classes, from handson courses to demonstrations and tasting. Their classes are small, giving participants space and individual attention.

Martry Mill - Working Water Mill Tour

Martry Mill is one of the few working watermills in Ireland, with the earliest records dating back to 1641. Meet the maker James who will guide you through the milling process to make their stoneground wholemeal flour, the mill buildings, and its history.

Organic Farm Tour at Rock Farm Slane

Rock Farm Slane is an organic farm with glamping and selfcatering houses, located on the Slane Castle estate. The guided farm tour offers a fascinating insight into the 90-acre organic farm, stretching for 1.5km along the banks of the River Boyne. Private tours and tastings are available. Sea Louth Food Experience – Scenic Seafood Trail

Your Sea Louth passport (download from the website or pick up at a local tourist office) will guide you to 14 scenic viewpoints along the trail and lists over 40 restaurants where you can enjoy the fresh local seafood along with information on the local seafood producers.
